Risks and Rewards for Cloud Computing offers the Federal Government an opportunity to achieve cost efficiency and improvements in the return-on-investment (ROI) of IT operations. However, with any IT opportunity comes challenges and concerns over security requirements and risks (business/mission, program management, security, operational, etc.). Depending upon the cloud service model (public vs. private, IaaS vs. PaaS vs. SaaS), security and risk concerns could vary, but would still play a key role in the decision to move to the cloud.
